

Reporting Emergency Situations

When reporting any emergency situation, a crime or suspicious activity, please follow these steps:

1. Give your name and address.
2. Report why you are calling.
3. Request medical assistance, if needed.
4. Give as many details as possible:
 - Description of activity being observed.
 - Description of person(s) involved.
 - Location the person(s) was last seen or their direction of travel.
 - Description of any motor vehicle involved.
 - Presence of any weapon(s).
5. Stay on the phone until released by the officer receiving your call. Remember: Be calm, speak slowly, and obtain the names and addresses of any witnesses.

All reports of crime will be investigated and reported in accordance with the laws and regulations of the State of New Jersey, and in accordance with the definitions used in the Uniform Crime Reporting System of the Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation.

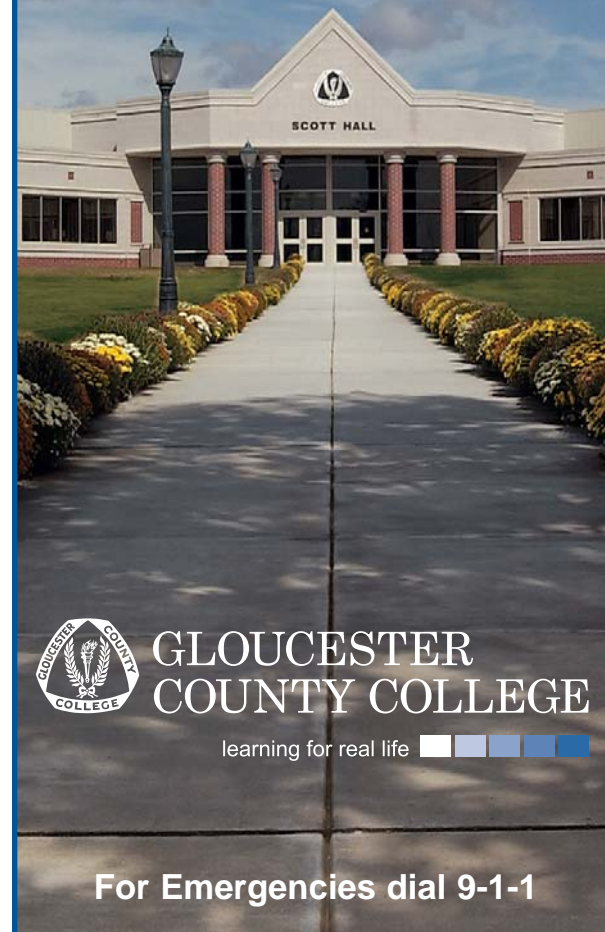

Gloucester County College Security

The GCC Security Department operates twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year. Uniformed campus security personnel maintain both mobile and foot patrols that cover the entire campus. They are always in radio contact with the Deptford Township Police Department and respond to emergency situations and calls for assistance.

Anyone may report emergencies by dialing ext. 4444 on campus phones. Other security extensions include 6287 and 6276. From an outside line, please dial 856-464-5207 (security land line) or 609-868-3963 (security cell phone). Several direct access phones to the Security Center Control Station are located in various locations on campus. They are clearly marked and located in every instructional building.

In addition to campus patrol personnel, the GCC Security Department maintains a Lost & Found, and an investigative area which provides crime prevention services, traffic accident reports, and administrative support.

Fire Alarms

All Gloucester County College buildings are equipped with fire alarms. In the event of fire or smoke conditions, or any other situation which requires evacuation of the building, the fire alarm will sound for the local fire department to respond. At the sound of the fire alarm all faculty/staff and students are **required** to evacuate the building immediately. After the condition has been rendered safe by the Fire Department, everyone may return.

Tips for Your Safety

Remember: Anyone is a potential victim of crime; however, there are steps you can take to protect yourself and your property. College Security will provide an escort to anyone who requests assistance.

1. Immediately notify the College Security Department if any person(s) or activity arouses your suspicion. College Security is located in the College Center near door A-8.
2. Notice and remember as much as possible. A good description of the suspect including age, sex, height, weight, clothing, and speech will assist Security.
3. Be sure to lock your motor vehicle when parking in our parking lots and secure anything of value in your trunk.
4. Do not leave property unprotected. Do not leave your belongings (books, backpacks, clothes, etc.) unattended in hallways, the gym, the library, or in classrooms.
5. In general, avoid the use of alcohol or drugs. Persons under the influence are more likely to be the victims of a serious crime or an accident. Possession of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs is prohibited on campus.
6. If you have a need for an escort to your vehicle, contact Security or call extension 6287 or 4444.
