**Title DELAWARE VALLEY COLLEGE SIGNS AGREEMENT
WITH GLOUCESTER COUNTY COLLEGE**

DOYLESTOWN, Pa., – Delaware Valley College signed a transfer agreement with Gloucester County College (GCC) on Monday, November 5, at 11 a.m. in Lasker Hall at DelVal’s campus.

The agreement allows GCC graduates meeting select criteria guaranteed admission to several Delaware Valley College bachelor’s degree programs. Generous scholarship opportunities will also be available to GCC students as well. The transfer agreement becomes effective September 2008.

Under the transfer agreement, GCC students are guaranteed admission into a bachelor’s degree program as juniors in DelVal’s Food Science and Management program. GCC students must graduate with an associate degree in food science and meet all other eligibility requirements.

In addition, GCC graduates who transfer to Delaware Valley College will be eligible for academic scholarships based on the agreement. Full-time students taking 12 or more credits a semester graduating from GCC with a 2.50 to 2.99 final grade-point-average (GPA) will receive a minimum of \$6,500; full-time students with a 3.00-3.49 final GPA will receive a minimum of \$8,000; and full-time students with a 3.50-4.0 final GPA will receive a minimum of \$9,000. Students who remain in good academic standing at Delaware Valley College may renew the scholarship for their senior year.

“We want to encourage Gloucester County College graduates

to continue their education,” said Robert Yapsuga, Ed.D., Vice President of Enrollment Management at Delaware Valley College. “By making these scholarships available, students will be able to pursue a bachelor’s degree and be prepared to enter careers in food science.”

“GCC’s transfer agreement with Delaware Valley College provides our students the means to secure an associate degree at an affordable cost and later further their education at a respected four-year institution,” stated William Anderson, chief operating officer of the USDOL food science grant. “This partnership brings the transfer process up front and makes educational goals readily accessible.”
