GCC SETS NOV. 30 OPEN HOUSE FOR STUDENT ART SHOW/ TREE-LIGHTING CEREMONY

Deptford Twp. - Gloucester County College will present an art show beginning at 11:30 a.m. [Friday, November 30](#), featuring the work of dozens of GCC student-artists.

The two-hour opening reception will offer paintings, drawings, photography, ceramics, digital art, sculpture, and mixed media according to Eoin Kinnarney, Director of The Art Gallery at GCC.

“We have a wealth of talent within our student body, as the exhibit will demonstrate,” said Kinnarney.

Youngsters from the Early Childhood Education Center will enjoy a visit from everyone’s favorite jolly old elf as the College kicks off the start of the holiday season during the annual tree-lighting ceremony. Festivities will also include the donation of a custom-designed orb to the GCC permanent art collection by glass artist Paul Stankard, of Mantua. Musician Mark Rust, who has written almost 200 original songs and plays the piano, guitar, fiddle, banjo, mountain dulcimer, and hammered dulcimer, will perform.

The Art Gallery at GCC welcomes public viewing six days a week. Gallery hours are Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Saturday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The show runs through January 15.
