GCC STUDENTS PUT ON THEIR JEANS TO FIGHT BREAST CANCER

Deptford Twp. - Gloucester County College's Student Government Association is kicking off Breast Cancer Awareness Month this October with Lee National Denim Day on the College's campus October 2.

Students, faculty and staff are encouraged to dress down in jeans this Friday in exchange for a \$5 donation to the Women's Cancer Programs of the Entertainment Industry Foundation. Funds raised support some of the most promising treatment and early detection research in the country, as well as the grassroots advocacy work of the National Breast Cancer Coalition.
