GCC EQUINE SCIENCE LAB DRAWS AWARENESS TO BONES AND MUSCLES

GCC’s new equine science program provides instruction and practical experience in the management, nutrition, physiology and care of horses with a strong foundation in biology, chemistry and business principles. After graduating from GCC with an associate degree, students are prepared for immediate employment in the equine industry or for transfer into an animal science or equine science major at a four-year institution. The College currently has program partnerships with Rutgers University, Cornell University and Delaware Valley College.
