**Associate in Science (A.S.) - Transfer**

*Nursing is a selective admission program. Students must be accepted to the program prior to registering for any NUR courses. Please contact the Enrollment Services Office for an admission packet.*

*Clinical agencies require criminal history background checks (CHBC) for all individuals engaged in patient care. All students must undergo a CHBC upon acceptance into the Nursing Program. CHBC results are sent to the clinical agencies, who have the sole discretion to decide if the student may engage in patient care at the agency. If a student is denied the opportunity to participate in the clinical agency as a result of the findings of the CHBC, the student will be dismissed from the Nursing Program.*

*Students must earn a grade of "C" or above in all nursing and biological science courses and maintain a GPA of 2.0 to remain in the Nursing Program. Students must satisfactorily complete all 100-level nursing courses and Anatomy & Physiology I and II to progress to 200-level nursing courses. Nursing students must meet all pre-requisite, co-requisite, and grade requirements for each college course listed in the Nursing program of study to advance through the Nursing program. Course pre-requisites and co-requisites are specified in the GCC college catalog. Students who do not meet pre-requisite and co-requisite course requirements, and/or grade requirements will not be able to progress in the Nursing program.*
