GCC To Host WBCA Pink Zone Basketball Game

Due to the weather postponement on February 1st the GCC Women's Basketball Team has extended their Pink Zone Basketball to the final two home games of the season. The women will be wearing pink and supporting the cause of breast cancer awareness on Tuesday February 15th at 5:00pm against Camden CC and Thursday February 17th against Atlantic Cape CC. At halftime of the February 15 game there will be a fun shooting contest featuring members of the Roadrunner teams other than basketball. At halftime of the February 17 game the women's basketball team will be honoring their sophomore athletes.



The WBCA Pink Zone initiative is a global, unified effort for the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) to assist in raising breast cancer awareness on the court, across campuses, in communities and beyond. The Roadrunners will be facing Atlantic Cape CC and the tipoff will take place at 5pm. Head Coach Tom McCormack has been organizing this event the last four years here at Gloucester County College.

At the game, fans, players, coaches, referees are all encouraged to wear pink in support of breast cancer awareness and will have the chance to win giveaways. Fans can also make \$1 donations to sign a banner in support of breast cancer awareness or in memory of a loved one who was affected by breast cancer. Each of the last two years the GCC team has been able to make contributions to the Kay Yow Foundation of between \$250-500 after the Pink Zone. If you are unable to attend the game you can make a donation by giving it to Coach McCormack.

The Roadrunners are proud to be one of more than 1,250 schools and organizations taking part in the effort to raise

money for breast cancer awareness and research. All proceeds from the event will be donated to the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund. The late Kay Yow, former North Carolina State head women's basketball coach and founding member of the WBCA passed away on January 24, 2009, after facing her third bout with the disease.
