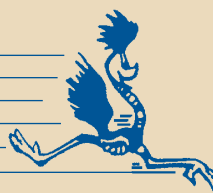

What is Middle States?

The Middle States Commission on Higher Education is an accrediting body who has the responsibility of evaluating institutional quality assurance issues for the purpose of certifying Academic Degree Programs. This process operates on a ten-year cycle.

Why is this important?

Colleges who do not receive accreditation are not authorized to distribute some forms of financial aid, may not receive other grant-in-aid funding, and



do not receive validation for accredited degree programs.

When will this take place?

The Middle States Team will be on our campus April 13-16, 2008 for our on-site evaluation.

Will the evaluation team

want to speak to students? Yes! The team will be here to look at specific topics called "standards," but they will also talk to students about their experiences at GCC.

If the team speaks to us, how should we respond? You should speak freely and honestly about your classroom and extracurricular experiences with the College. You might discuss why you chose GCC and how it is or has helped you to improve your skills or how the College and its faculty and staff have contributed to your overall academic development and preparation.

Things you should know:

There are five standards being evaluated: Integrity, Educational Offerings, General Education, Institutional Effectiveness, and Assessment of Student Learning

The College affirms six core values. They are:

Commitment to Students, Commitment to Excellence in Education, Contribution to community, Commitment to Access and Diversity, Commitment to Faculty and Staff, and Quality of Campus Environment.

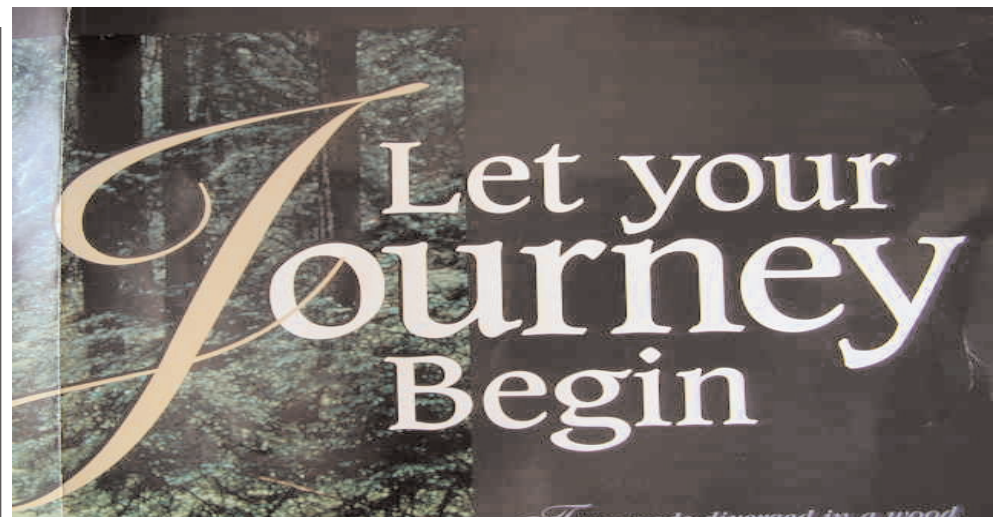
EOF - Be Wise - Register Early for Fall 2008 Classes
